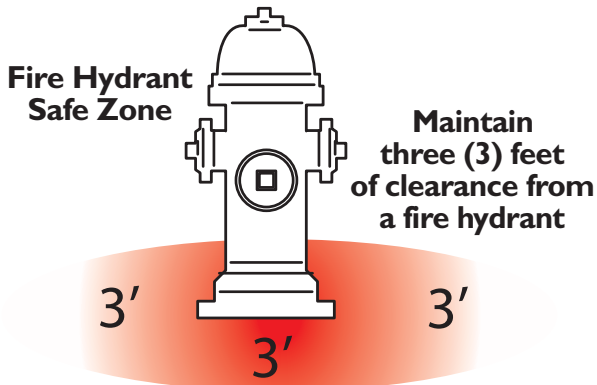

Citizens Have a Part Protecting Life and Property



The INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE requires that citizens and property owners do their part to make sure that firefighters can easily see fire hydrants and encounter no hindrance in gaining immediate access to fire hydrants and other fire protection equipment.

Keep posts, fences, vehicles, shrubbery and vegetative growth, trash, storage, and other materials or objects at least three (3) feet away from fire hydrants, fire department inlet connections, and fire protection system control valves. When firefighters arrive on the scene of a fire, they have only *minutes*, sometimes *seconds*, to protect life and property. It is very important that they have full and unobstructed access to fire hydrants and connections. You never may have thought about it, but landscaping as simple as shrubbery and objects as common as a garbage cart can block immediate access to fire hydrants and connections.

-  Fire drills at home are **VITAL**.
