

## RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners (the "Board") of the Little Rock Municipal Water Works (the "Water Works"), that the Lake Maumelle Watershed Protection Plan Phase II (the "Plan") as set forth below is hereby adopted;

### LAKE MAUMELLE WATERSHED PROTECTION PLAN PHASE II

#### INTRODUCTION:

On July 31, 1992, the Board of Commissioners determined by appropriate resolution that Lake Maumelle's characteristics increase the lake's vulnerability to pollutants and that the watershed was threatened; consequently the Board of Commissioners determined that it was necessary to protect the Lake Maumelle watershed from pollution and that lands within the watershed should be acquired to protect the public water supply in Lake Maumelle from pollution. As a first step toward achieving this goal, the Water Works has acquired most of the property within one-quarter mile of the mean high water mark of Lake Maumelle. This plan sets forth the second phase of action necessary to implement the Commission's July 31, 1992 resolution.

#### DEFINITIONS:

The watershed has two subbasins. The eastern boundary of the Western Subbasin is the Arkansas Highway 10 bridge across Lake Maumelle and the ridge lines running in a north and south direction lying north and south of the bridge. The **Western Subbasin** consists of all lands in the watershed west of that eastern boundary.

For recreation control and other purposes the lake has heretofore been divided into three zones which constitute the Eastern Subbasin.

**Zone 3 Drainage Area** consists of all lands in the watershed lying between the Western Subbasin and the western boundary of zone 2 extended north and south through the watershed.

**Zones 1 and 2 Drainage Area** consists of all lands lying in the watershed east of the Zone 3 Drainage Area.

#### ACTION PLAN:

I. Zones 1 and 2 Drainage Areas except the spillway area lands.

✓ Action: Acquire all land within the drainage area.

II. Zone 3 Drainage Area and the spillway area lands.

Action: Acquire critical contaminant area lands in the drainage area.  
Acquire other lands when offered for sale by landowners utilizing purchase and lease back agreements, management agreements, or other owner use agreements when practical.  
Obtain land use agreements on all lands within the drainage and spillway areas not acquired.

III. Western Subbasin lands.

Action: Acquire critical contaminant area lands.  
Acquire other lands when offered for sale by landowners utilizing purchase and lease back agreements, management agreements, or other owner use agreements when practical.  
Utilize enforcement of Health Department and PC&E regulations.  
Establish coordination with Health Department and PC&E to review their permit applications within the watershed.
